WHAT KIND OF FRIEND ARE YOU?

This week, we take a look at different kinds of friends.

Dedicated Friends (DFs)

DFs put their friends and family first. If you have a problem, they will discuss the situation with you and try to help you fix

it. If you need money, a DF will lend it to you. DFs don't suddenly appear. It takes months or years for a person to become a DF. But one thing is sure, the best way to find and keep a DF is to be a DF yourself.

Enthusiastic Friends (EFs)

EFs may not be the friends who will lend you money or help you solve your problems, but they will show you how to get the most out of life. EFs are adventurous and want to try everything – exotic foods, roller coasters, adventure vacations, you name it! They're also optimistic. Wise Friends (WFs)
