## Empty Boat Found Near Tasmania

An Australian sea rescue team is searching for three men who disappeared while they were sailing in the Pacific Ocean. Their empty boat was found forty miles from the island of Tasmania.

Everything on board looked normal. Things were in order, the computers were turned

on, their cell phones were on the table, and the table was set for dinner, but there were no people. "The last message from the men was five days ago," said Jack Wilson, a member of the rescue team. "Since then, no one has heard from them."
