

In 2010, the American Dialect Society chose “app” as the word of the year. “App” is short for “application.” It’s a program for an electronic device like a smartphone or a tablet computer. There are more than 425,000 apps that can be downloaded for entertainment, shopping, sports scores, and anything else you might be interested in.

Apps are so popular because they can be used almost anywhere – commuting on a bus, waiting in a doctor’s office, or hanging out at the mall. And all you need is your smartphone. You don’t need to log into your computer or into a website. You don’t have to set up your video game console. You don’t even need a Wi-Fi connection.

Most smartphones can hold hundreds of apps, and you can use more than one app at a time. For instance, you can use a navigation app to find a new restaurant, a dining app to look at the restaurant’s menu, and a weather forecast app to decide what to wear to the restaurant – all at the same time.

One of the most popular apps, Angry Birds, has been downloaded by more than 50 million people. In 2010, this app was played 200 million minutes daily by app users, or 1.2 billion hours a year. The Apple Store began selling apps in 2008 with nearly one billion sold. In 2010, nearly 3 billion apps were sold at an average price of \$2.13. Not only are apps popular – they’re also profitable!
