Which state?

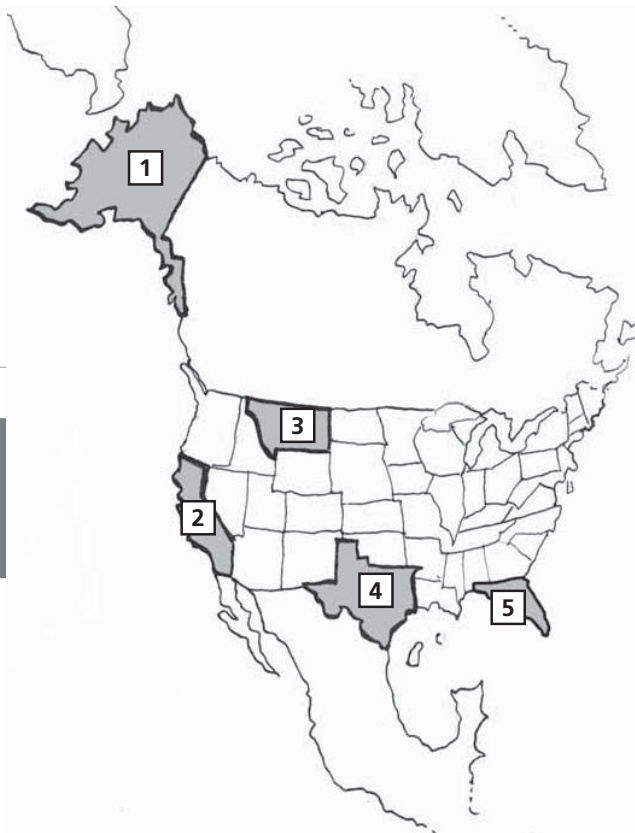
A There were 70 groups of Native American Indians living in this state before Europeans arrived. The Pacific Ocean is on one side of the state. Inland you can find one of the hottest deserts in the world, Death Valley. This state is famous for Hollywood, Disney Land and the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco.

B This is one of the biggest states. It's east coast is on the Gulf of Mexico. It borders Mexico to the south and west. It's called the Lone Star State. The main industry here was cattle ranching in the 19th century. In the 20th century the major industry became oil.

C This state has the Gulf of Mexico on one side and the Atlantic Ocean on the other side. It's famous for its sunshine, Disney World, and the Kennedy Space Center. It has great beaches and you can go on trips to see crocodiles and strange mammals called manatees in its national park.

D This is the biggest state in the USA. It isn't next to any other US state but it is next to another English speaking country, Canada. The USA bought this state from Russia in 1867. It's very cold here in winter and it's the only state in the USA with towns above the Arctic Circle.

E This state is in the north of the USA. Canada is to the north and Wyoming is to the south. There are a lot of mountains here including parts of the Rocky Mountain range. In fact, it's name comes from the Spanish word for 'mountain'. There are lots of animals, including grizzly bears, but there aren't many people.
