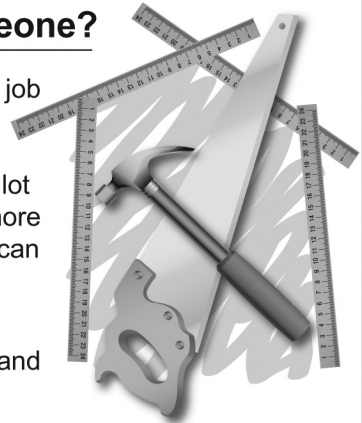

Have you ever thought about doing a home repair or redecoration job yourself? 1. _____

- **Is it small enough?** Many home-improvement projects require a lot of time and energy, and they often have a way of becoming more complicated once they get started. 2. _____ Almost any project can quickly become much more than one person can handle alone.
- **Do you have the skills?** Even a medium-sized project such as modernizing a bathroom or a kitchen can require plumbing and electrical work. 3. _____
- **Can you really save money?** There's no doubt about it – the work of professionals can be expensive, and most people would rather not pay a decorator thousands of dollars to redesign the interior of their home. 4. _____ Suppose you decide to order and install new kitchen cabinets and countertops, but when they arrive, you find that they don't fit properly or that you hate how they look. Then you end up having to replace them, which costs you a lot more. You are less likely to make mistakes if you hire a professional to plan your project and to help you make intelligent decisions. 5. _____ You might also save yourself some stress!
